



## **Speyside**

Speyside is recognised as the crème de la crème of whisky production and is home to more than half of Scotland's malt distilleries, 12 in total.

Broadly speaking, Speyside whiskies can be classified as falling into one of two camps. At one end of the spectrum there are the light, grassy, 'lunchtime whiskies' such as Glenlivet; at the other end lie the rich, sweet, sherried qualities of Glenrothes and Macallan.

Quite full-bodied, spicy rich fruitcake, toffee notes and a creamy malty-feel.

Balvenie Double Wood 12 Year Old (40%) $\pounds$ 4.25 Sweet and malty palate with wonderfully expressive notes of bourbon barrel –particularly vanilla and nutmeg.
Benromach 10 Year Old (43%)£ 3.75 Barley, slightly herbal, a little fruit, grassy. Big on malt, ground ginger.
Cardhu 12 Year Old (40%)£ 4.75 Smooth, rounded, gentle sweetness, soft peat. A little smoke whispers sweet nothings.
Cragganmore 12 Year Old (40%)£ 4.75  Manuka honey and apricots. A touch of roasted chestnut, Nutella and cranberry.
Glenfiddich 12 Year Old (40%)£ 3.75 A gentle, easy-going palate with creamy spices, alongside buttery toffee, apple strudel and wine-like malt.
<b>Glenlivet Founder's Reserve (40%)</b> £ 3.75 Full gold in colour. Fruity overall backed by sweet biscuit notes. The taste is sweet with a creamy finish.
<b>Glenlivet 18 Year Old (43%)</b> £ <b>6.25</b> Full and rich with notes of chewy, tannic oak. Manuka honey and walnut with Cox's apples and orange peels. Cut herbs; fennel and spearmint.
Glenrothes Select Reserve (43%)£ 4.75  Malty and sweet palate with gingerbread, Manuka honey, custard and potpourri.
Knockando 12 Year Old (43%)£ 3.75 Barley wine leads the way with cinnamon, wood-smoke and heather honey.
Macallan Gold (40%)£ 4.25 Spices, vanilla, walnut and rich malt. A good dolloped of fermented honey too.
StrathIsla 12 Year Old (40%)£ 3.75 Malty core with notes of sultanas and cinnamon pastries. Allspice, cooked apple and mince pies.

#### Islay

The southernmost of its island chain, Islay is known as 'The Queen of the Hebrides' – and is certainly the reigning monarch of a typically smoky, peaty style of single malt whisky. But there's much more to this beating heart of distillation, which has eight active producers – and more to come. The southern distilleries, Ardbeg, Laphroaig and Lagavulin are the most intense and not for the faint hearted.

Ardbeg 10 Year Old (46%)£ 4.75
A mix of sweet, creamy vanilla, rich Ardbeg peat smoke, a thick and palate-coating whisky with hints of limoncello, a little lime zest, cocoa and black pepper.
Bowmore 12 Year Old (40%)£ 4.25  A big palate with dark peat, apple blossom.
Bruichladdich 10 Year Old (46%)£ 4.25  A mellow, oak sweetness with hints of bourbon and gingerbread, sherry and sultanas. Its fresh and frictionless, the texture of warm honey – then dry, crispy, malt barley.
Bunnahabhain 12 Year Old (46.3%)£ 4.25 Apples, oranges and Oloroso sherry notes. Light caramel, hazelnut and malt.
Caol Ila 12 Year Old (43%)£ 4.75 A rich palate of oil, tar and elegant smoke.
Lagavulin 16 Year Old (43%)£ 6.25 Thick, full-bodied palate with Oloroso melding well with huge smoke notes, supple pear and toasty oak.
<b>Laphroig 10 Year Old (40%)</b> Kelp, rum & raisin ice-cream, medicinal notes, smouldering peat and exotic spices.

## Liqueurs

A liqueur is an alcoholic beverage made from a distilled spirit flavoured with either fruit, cream, herbs, spices, flowers or nuts. Liqueurs are historical descendants of herbal medicines.

Baileys (17%) Ireland£ 3.25 Baileys is a perfect mix of fresh, premium quality Irish dairy cream, finest spirits, Irish whiskey and a proprietary recipe of chocolate flavours.
Disaronno/Amaretto (28%) Italy£ 3.00 Amber-coloured, velvety almond-flavoured liqueur created in Italy. It is a truly popular traditional digestif with intense flavour made from 17 herbs and fruits steeped in crushed apricot kernel oil. Although it tastes like almonds, it does not contain nuts.
<b>Drambuie Whisky Liqueur (40%) Scotland£ 3.50</b> A combination of aged Scotch whiskies, heather honey and a recipe of secret ingredients, Drambuie is one of the best-known whisky liqueurs worldwide.
Frangelico (20%) Italy£ 3.00 Legendary Italian hazelnut liqueur made to a recipe dating around 300 years. Named after Father Angelico, a famous hermit monk of the day.
<b>Glayva (35%) Scotland</b> £ <b>3.25</b> Hugely popular Scottish liqueur made with whisky, honey, spices, almonds and tangerines. The name is the phonetic pronunciation of the Gaelic 'gle mhath' meaning 'very good'.
<b>Grand Marnier (40%) France</b> £ 3.95  Possibly the best known and most prestigious French liqueur in the world. Grand Marnier Cordon Rouge is delicate blend of fine Cognacs from the best growing areas, and distilled essence of wild tropical oranges.

#### slands

There are nearly 800 islands scattered off Scotland's crenelated coastline, of which only a few are inhabited – and fewer still have a distillery.

Excluding the whisky hotspot of Islay, the islands of Arran, Mull, Jura, Skye, Lewis and Orkney are home to an eclectic mix of styles, from light citrus to full-on peat smoke.

#### Campbeltown

Campbeltown was once a thriving malt whisky region of no fewer than 34 distilleries – no mean feat for a small and remote settlement at the bottom of the long Kintyre peninsula. Now only two producers remain, but they make up for their paucity by producing five distinctive malt whiskies between them.

#### Lowlands

There's more distillation in the Lowlands than any other Scottish region, but its days as a significant single malt player are consigned to history. This is the home of the blend, and of the large quantities of grain whisky which form its foundation – but a few producers keep up the trademark light and grassy Lowland malt style.

#### The multi-coloured tapestry of rum styles spanning the Caribbean, Central & South America is as rich as the history and culture that encircles this great spirit.

Hendricks (41.4%) Scotland
Ophir (40%) England£ 3.75 Warm and exotic spice alonside sweet citrus notes. Perfect served with ginger ale.
Rock Rose Gin (42%) Scotland£ 3.50  Juniper berries, rhodibla rosea from the cliffs of Caithness
Sipsmith (41.6%) England£ 3.50 The quintessential expression of a classic, traditional London Dry Gin. Bold, complex and aromatic, but rich and balanced. Perfect for a gin and tonic.
Strathearn Heather Rose (40%) Scotland£ 3.00 Heather Rose Gin has a combination of rose and heather with a prosecco character. The colour of the gin changes to a delicate pink when tonic is added.
Strathearn Scottish (47%) Scotland£ 3.00  Double distilled. Woody, earthy and very slightly sweet juniper, with a hint of lemon peel.
<b>Tanqueray (43.1%) England</b> £ 2.75  Very flavoursome with a tart cut, snappy spice and alcoholic heat on the finish.
Tanqueray 10 (47.3%) England£ 4.75 Sublimely fresh with depth highlighted by flavours of grapefruit, orange & lime.Mellowed by juniper and camomile.
The Botanist (46%) Scotland£ 3.75 Made by the geniuses at the Bruichladdich Distillery, this Islay gin is packed full with an array of different botanicals – including wild Islay juniper.

### Mighlands

By far the largest producing region, the Highland region stretches from the North of Glasgow all the way to the northernmost tip of the east coast and beyond. It incorporates probably the widest range of styles of malt whisky, and as a result, it is difficult to make sweeping statements. Edradour has long prided itself on being Scotland's smallest distillery, and is situated near the popular Perthshire town of Pitlochry.

Auchroisk 10 Year Old (43%)£ 5.25  Quite sweet with a pleasant softness, light, fresh and well balanced with apple sweetness.
Dalmore Malt 12 Year Old (40%)£ 4.75 Orange and cocoa on the palate, with hints of wintry spices, a little cocoa and café lattes.
Dalwhinnie 15 Year Old (43%)£ 4.75
A malty palate with walnut loaf, acacia honey and cinnamon.
<b>Deanston 12 Year Old (46.3%)</b> £ 3.75 Supple palate with creamy malt, salty oak and marzipan.
Edradour 10 Year Old (40%)£ 4.75 A sweet, thick palate with dark rum, custard apples, chocolate malt and golden syrup.
Glen Garioch 12 Year Old (48%)£ 4.75  Matured in American bourbon to lighten and Spanish sherry casks to add dimension in flavouring. Its aromas include fresh heather, poached pears and oak undertones.
Glengoyne 10 Year Old (40%)£ 3.75  A malty, sweet palate, again with that bourbon character coming through. This is incredibly creamy and luxurious, and it develops gently with dried figs and barley.
Glenmorangie 10 Year Old (40%)£ 3.50 A well-balanced, rounded palate with rhubarb and custard sweets, nectarine slices in Greek yoghurt, drizzled with chestnut honey, and a hint of chocolate éclair sweets.
Oban Malt 14 Year Old (43%)£ 5.25 A rich and smoky nose with notes of seaweed saltiness. The taste is smooth with notes of sweetness and citrus and the finish is of a good length.
Old Pulteney 12 Year Old (40%)£ 3.75  Dry, medium bodied and smooth, redolent of honey and cream, faintly salty with a slight spicy note and a sweet long-lasting finish.
Royal Lochnagar 12 Year Old (40%)£ 4.75
Delightful balance of fruit and spices. Pleasantly acidic; such initial sweetness as there is quickly subsumed by acidity.
Tullibardine Sovereign (43%)£ 3.75
A delicious creamy single malt which was aged in first-fill bourbon barrels before bottling. Expect plenty of vanilla and spice from this Highland Dram.

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## Cognac/Armagnac

For the past three centuries, Cognac has been almost universally recognised as the finest of all the spirits that are distilled from grapes.

Courvoisier V.S Cognac (40%) France£ 2.75  Courvoisier VS is a cognac with a floral oaky flavour. It has notes of spring flowers and
ripe fruits including pear, lemon and orange in its aroma.
Martell V.S Cognac (40%) France£ 3.25  Martell VS is seen as a bright young cognac with a fresh, fruity side.
<b>Rémy Martin V.S.O.P Mature Cask (40%) France.</b> £ 3.75 Rémy Martin VSOP Mature Cask Finish is composed of eau-de-vie coming exclusively from the most sought-after vineyards of Cognac.
Janneau Armagnac Brandy (40%) France£ 3.50  A blend of eau de vie, the youngest being seven years old. The longer maturation in Montlezun oak gives this style considerable smoothness and a superb fragrance

#### Gín

Blackwoods (40%) Scotland
Boe Violet (41.5%) Scotland£ 3.50  Boe Superior Gin is infused with violets to create Boe Violet Gin Liqueur. The addition of violets creates a stylish gin with a light, delicate taste and beautiful colour and aroma.
Bombay Sapphire (40%) England£ 2.75 Bombay Sapphire gin is one of the most recognised and popular gins available. It is also relatively subtle when it comes to juniper, with other botanicals also coming to the forefront.
Brockmans (40%) England£ 3.50  An English Gin, Brockmans is distilled in a 100 year old traditional copper still and made from a recipe of different botanicals; Juniper, blueberries, blackberries, cassia, bark, liquorice, lemon peel, coriander, angelica, orange peel, almonds and orris.
Caorunn (41%) Scotland£ 3.50 With 5 unique Scottish botanicals, Caorunn (pronounced Ka-roon) gin has some distinct characteristics. It has a sweetness and warmth within the fruity flavours, whilst being lighter on juniper and citrus. A balanced and enjoyable gin.
Daffy's (43.4%) Scotland£ 3.50 Daffy's Gin is fresh, smooth and complex - expertly balanced to combine the pine, citrus, floral, sweet and woody notes that are all evident. Do try it neat as it is very moreish sipped over ice or in a gin and tonic.
Edinburgh Gin (40%) Scotland£ 3.00 This small batch gin is well balanced and crisp, with hints of gingery spice, a scent of heather, and a subtle citrus edge.
Edinburgh Raspberry Gin (20%) Scotland
Edinburgh Rhubarb & Ginger (20%) Scotland£ 3.00 A zesty gin liqueur with rhubarb and ginger. Generally sweet, but with sharp and spicy twists.
Gordon's (37.5%) England£ 1.90 Gordon's dry gin is carefully distilled using a secret recipe. The distinctively refreshing taste comes from the finest handpicked juniper berries and a selection of other botanicals. It's the taste that's made Gordon's the world's best-selling London dry gin.
