

Our team and owners have done their uppermost to ensure that all necessary steps have been taken throughout our establishment to ensure a COVID-safe environment for all our guests and staff. Things are going to feel a bit different but you will still feel the passion we put in our work.



SOCIAL DISTANCING

We thank you in advance to keep a 2m distance with other guests and members of staff especially while accessing the building our waiting for your table.

The resident lounge and courtyard are for you to use but can we kindly ask you not to move the sofas and armchairs.

Hand sanitisers are at your disposal throughout the hotel.

HOUSEKEEPING

Your cottage has been thoroughly cleaned then sanitised following Government advice. We sanitise hard surfaces using a viricidal solution (tested against BS EN14476) and steam curtains, furnishing and floors. All our communal areas are regularly desinfected and we also use ozone air purifiers.

AMENITIES

Guests and hotel inspectors praise all the little touches in our rooms. With social distancing in mind we have removed half of our tables and introduced 4 sitting times for dinner: 6pm - 6:30pm 8pm - 8:30pm. Our heart-warming bar boasts a fabulous array of artisan gins and single malts, as well as our very own cask real ale 'Lure of Meikleour', developed for us by The Strathbraan Brewery. Wine lovers won't be disappointed with 13 different wines by the glass and a substantial wine list to choose from with selections from vineyards all over the world. Our lady owner is from Bordeaux and we have our very own house claret, "le Nid du Héron".

We hold a table for our guests for evening meals, please confirm your time with a member of staff the night before or at breakfast.

BAR HOURS

Monday to Sunday 11am - 11pm, Friday & Saturday 11am - 12pm, Sunday 12pm - 11pm (drinking at bar counter not possible during COVID 19 restrictions)

We can organise a picnic hamper for you – ideal for those spending a day on the river or exploring the beautiful countryside. Please let us know the evening prior by filling out the picnic form.

COVID-19 Update: During your stay, your room will be cleaned on request only.

Please use the sign "make my room" and your bedroom will be serviced by our housekeepers, with a linen change over on every third day of your stay.

TOWELS

Please help us maintain our commitment to being environmentally friendly by preventing the unnecessary washing of towelling.

- If you leave your towels in the bath/shower, we will gladly change them.
- If you leave your towels on the rail, you are happy to re-use them.

However, if you do need any additional bedding, linen or the beds changed sooner please don't hesitate in asking.

PETS

We are a dog friendly hotel with dedicated dog-friendly rooms which are thoroughly steam-cleaned after each visit. We kindly ask that they are kept off the soft furnishings throughout the hotel, if you have forgotten their bed we have some washable ones to borrow as well as doggy towels. We kindly ask you **NOT** to leave your dog alone in the cottage, there are areas in the restaurant for pet owners.

There is an outside tap available to wash any muddy paws before coming into the hotel (applies for welly boots as well!).

Pets stay for free but we hope you will understand why a fee may be charged if further extensive cleaning of any property is required or if furnishings need to be dry-cleaned or repaired.

ADDITIONAL FACILITIES

You will find extra logs situated in the wooden boxes between both sets of cottages, please use this.

HEATING & HOT WATER

The heating and hot water supplies within the estate buildings come from an eco-friendly biomass boiler which operates continuously 24 hours a day. The thermostat for the central heating can be found on the wall in the hallway, as you enter the cottage – adjust this to change the temperature in your cottage. Each individual radiator can also be adjusted should you require different temperatures in each room.

THINGS TO DO

SALMON FISHING

The Meikleour Arms has been serving anglers for more than 200 years. The River Tay is one of the most productive salmon rivers in the UK and attracts anglers from all over the world. The largest salmon ever caught in the UK, 64lbs, was caught by a lady just minutes away from our building.

The season starts on the 15th of January (we are proud to host the official opening ceremony of the river) and finishes on the 15th of October.

For conservation purposes the River operates a "catch and release" policy which means that all salmon caught must be promptly and safely put back in the water. It is a criminal offense to kill a wild salmon between the 15th of January and the 31st of March.

Meikleour Estate maintain their own salmon fishing beat, the iconic Upper Islamouth and Meikleour beat (www. islamouth.co.uk). We welcome anglers of all levels and provide equipment if necessary. The most enjoyable and safest way to discover and appreciate the mighty Tay is from a traditional Tay wooden cobble with your personal Ghillie. Our guided day boat salmon fishing price starts at £150/day for up to two anglers, with equipment and standard tuition included.

There are many other beats around us that we would happily recommend, just ask us.

GOLF

If you are a keen golfer, then you are in the right place! Meikleour Arms; well-located having many golf courses nearby.

THINGS TO DO

FALCONRY ON THE ESTATE

Meikleour Arms guests have the opportunity to be introduced to the art of falconry. Stewart will take you with his birds around the woodlands on the Estate, where you can walk with the hawks and learn to fly them. Please ask a member of the team for more information.

WALKING & HIKING

The village of Meikleour is the ideal place for guests looking to enjoy the outdoors.

We highly recommend a walk along the Estate's beautiful North Wood (take the path on the left of the restaurant entrance) or a walk along the river Tay. Our pebble beach will delight bird watchers but we kindly ask you to keep dogs under control especially during the spring and the salmon spawning season (Nov-Dec).

You can download on our website a map of recommended walks (see our Things to Do section)

For walks a little further afield, here are a few you may be interested in:

- The Bluebell Woods, Blairgowrie Beautiful in the spring, awash with a carpet of bluebells.
- The Hermitage, Dunkeld Towering Douglas firs, a spectacular waterfall and a picture sque folly.
- Bealach na Searmon, Pitlochry Woodland and open hillside leading to a walk along the River Garry.

SKIING

Glenshee Ski Centre

Glenshee hosts some of the UK's most extensive skiing and snowboarding facilities.

They have an impressive 22 lifts and 36 runs – offering a diversity of terrain for all standards of skiers and snowboarders.

VISITOR ATTRACTIONS

There is a wide selection of visitor attractions for you, whether you are visiting the area for the first time or returning to explore more of beautiful Perthshire. Have a look through the *Welcome to Perthshire Guide* in your room for some inspiration. Here are a few options recommended by us.

SCONE PALACE

5* visitor attraction combining amazing history, art & antiques, architecture and of course fun for the children.

GLAMIS CASTLE

The birthplace of the Queen Mother. Tour the castle, explore the gardens & enjoy afternoon tea – you will not be untouched by the magic of Glamis Castle.

THE LAND ROVER EXPERIENCE SCOTLAND

For a fun day off road we highly recommend the Land Rover Experience Scotland near Dunkeld, they also offer one hour quad treks for everyone from 12 year old.

PITLOCHRY DAM VISITOR CENTRE

Showcases the rich history of hydroelectricity in the north of Scotland and how it transformed lives. Thousands visit the Dam to see the salmon swim to their breeding grounds up river and now everyone can learn the secrets of that incredible journey.

THE HOUSE OF BRUAR

The House of Bruar sits at the foot of the Bruar Falls near Blair Atholl Castle. Widely acknowledged as the Harrods of the Highlands it has everything Scottish; from fine cashmere, high-end tablet to artwork. If you are a small group they are happy to welcome you for a complimentary guided tour (the shop is vast!).

AIRPORTS

Edinburgh International Airport is 53 miles away, so allow at least 1 hr 30 minutes depending on the traffic over the Queensferry Crossing Bridge.

Glasgow International Airport is situated on the south side of Glasgow. It is 78 miles away, so allow 2 hours depending on the time of day for the Glasgow traffic.

Dundee Airport is 30 minutes away and has regular flights from and to London City.
